UN worries for underage mums: 7.3 million poor girls of poor states: KARACHI - Motherhood in childhood is a serious problem in developing countries, where every year 7.3 million girls under 18 give birth, states the United Nations Population Fund. According to UNFPA report titled 'Motherhood in Childhood: Facing the Challenge of Adolescent Pregnancy', out of the 7.3 million births, 2 million are to girls who are 14 or younger, many of whom suffer grave long-term health and social consequences from pregnancy such as obstetric fistula, and an estimated 70,000 adolescents in developing countries who die each year from complications during pregnancy and childbirth...'It has been shown globally that keeping girls in schools helps delay child marriage and early pregnancies, rendering life skills programme creates better understanding about their physical, emotional and mental well being and awareness in accessing sexual reproductive health information and services uplift their status in the society.' said Rabbi Royan, Country Representative, UNFPA Pakistan...(Nation, 31 Oct 2013)

Pakistan most likely culprit behind Syrian polio outbreak, claimsWHO: ISLAMABAD: While final genetic sequencing results are still awaited, there is a strong possibility that the isolated viruses that have triggered a polio outbreak in Syria, a country that has been free of wild poliovirus circulation since 1999, have their origin in Pakistan, informed sources associated with the polio eradication initiative confided here on Wednesday. Of the 22 children who suffered Acute Flaccid Paralysis (AFP) in Syria on October 17, ten are confirmed to having been crippled by wild poliovirus type 1...When the possibility of poliovirus exportation to Syria was discussed with the chief of polio eradication at the World Health Organization (WHO) Dr. Elias Durry, he neither outrightly rejected the likelihood of the virus having been exported from Pakistan, nor unreservedly accepted it in the absence of laboratory confirmation...(TheNews, 31 Oct 2013)

"Pakistan is the only endemic country where access to children has been banned in certain areas which is not the case anywhere else in the world," Azmat Abbas, communications specialist for Unicef in Pakistan told The News....The Unicef data revealed that a total of 664,000 children missed vaccination during the recent NID.
