The objective of the action is to support Indonesia's fight against corruption by strengthening the Corruption Eradication Commission (KPK), providing specialised anti-corruption training and by strengthening the implementation of the National Action Plan on Corruption Eradication (RAN-PK). Improved governance, the Indonesian public's renewed trust in government and a more secure economic and social environment is sought to be the end result. This in turn will contribute to the overarching objective of improving the rule of law and security in Indonesia.
