• To issue a position statement and disseminate.

• Issue and provide technical support to establish minimum standards and entry criteria for voluntary evidence-based drug dependent treatment options.

• Document good practice models e.g. Malaysia phaseout



Policy & Treatment Environments OUTCOMES for the Community

• Know your rights, stop blaming yourself.

• Be involved in the programmatic response.



Policy & Treatment Environments OUTCOMES for Civil Society

• Advocate, at a country level, for voluntary evidence/human rights-based drug dependence treatment options.

For organizations specializing in human rights.

- Provide training in both human and civil rights for the community.
- Provide channels for voicing concerns to specialized respective bodies.



Policy & Treatment Environments OUTCOMES for Parliamentarians

- Remove barriers to discriminatory and stigmatizing policy and legislation for people who use drugs.
- Adopt UN minimum standards and entry criteria.
- Advocate for drug dependence as a chronic relapsing health condition.



Policy & Treatment Environments OUTCOMES for Parliamentarians

 Manage voluntary evidence-based drug dependence treatment under the health sector.

 Commit national budget for sustainable and voluntary, evidence-based drug dependence treatment options involving all stakeholders



Policy & Treatment Environments OUTCOMES for national governments

• Provide strategic and sustainable planning and costing for voluntary, evidence-based drug dependence treatment options.



Policy & Treatment Environments OUTCOMES for Donors

• Avoid supporting non evidence-based drug treatment (except for humanitarian reasons).

• Support voluntary evidence-based drug dependence treatment options through a collaborative strategic planning process with national governments
