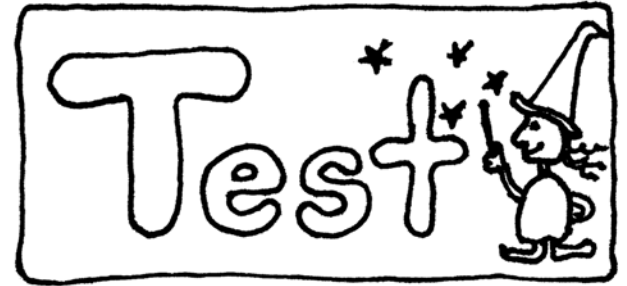

**46.43%** of UN staff in the Asia-Pacific  
know their current HIV status






**40.38%** of UN staff in the Asia-Pacific  
have never undergone an HIV test





**60.26%** of UN staff in the Asia-Pacific are not aware of UN Plus, the UN system-wide advocacy group of staff living with HIV



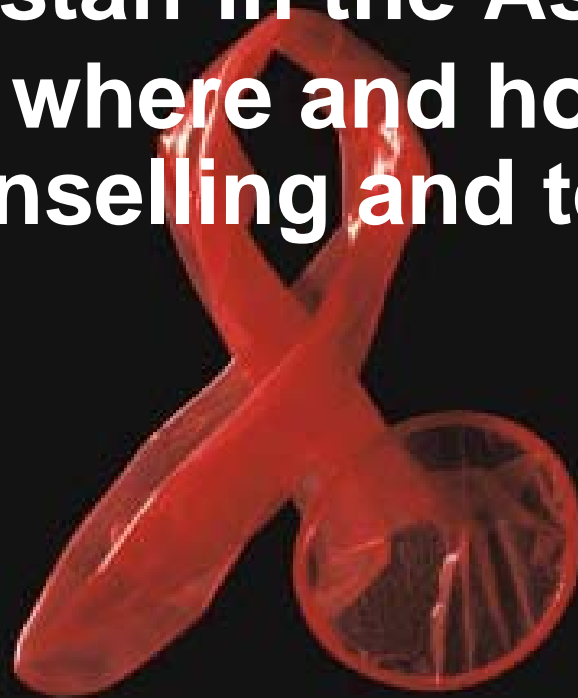
**16.20%** of UN staff in the Asia-Pacific are not aware that the UN has zero tolerance for discrimination on the basis of actual or perceived HIV status



**25.66%** of UN staff in the Asia-Pacific know how to access a PEP starter kit within 72 hrs



**35.81%** of UN staff in the Asia-Pacific are not aware of where and how to access voluntary counselling and testing for HIV





**53.37%** of UN staff in the Asia-Pacific believe some level of HIV-related discrimination occurs in the UN workplace
