

National Data Collection Network in Cambodia

- 2005, NACD established Drug Information Center to response drug data network in Cambodia.
- 2006, Cambodia joints DAINAP which reports were sent through hard copy by filing the form produce by UNODC and then later the report were sent through DAINAP, quarterly, case by case and annually respectively.
- 2006, data network system coverage nationally in 24 provincial drug control committees.

- 2009, UNODC Global Smart Programme strengthen the capacity of data collection in Cambodia- training was provided to the data sources in Oct 2009 by UNODC Project office in Cambodia in line with the forms used in Commune Competitive Plan Against Drug Offenses which initiated in 2006.
- November 2009, PDCCs of Takeo, Svay Reang organized workshop for CCP
- Dec 2009, Phnom Penh PDCC organized workshop for CCP.
- Dec. 2009, UNODC Global Smart Programme support to organize National Workshop on CCP.

- The recommendation from the National Workshop (NW) as the following;
 - Strengthening the precursor control systems by interministerial cooperation meeting.
 - Training human resources on data collection for PDCCs
 - Organize a NW to review the outcome of CCP and the provision of basic material for office.
- May 2010, UNODC Global Smart Programme supported the National Workshop to the review results of CCP. The meeting was chaired by the Deputy Prime Minister of Cambodia


- Following the NW, there were may training courses in the provincial level on data collection, such as Kratie, Kompong Cham, Prey Veng, BCM, Battambang, etc.
 - Refreshing training were conducted on quarterly basic (GF Round7).
- Hundreds of staff were trained on how to use the forms properly and how to report.

Year 2010 Operation results by Police


- <u>First Principle of CCP</u>: (Cultivation, production and manufacture of drugs) Reached target totally: 47persons with 11female.
- <u>Second principle of CCP</u> (trafficking and selling drugs): reached target totally: 780 persons with 210 female.

Total Number of Drug Dependence




Total Number of Drug Dependence




Access Commune

- Long-term consultants are need to perform on job training to Drug Information Centre staffs.
