# OVERVIEW



- National Anti-Drugs Agency (NADA) is the focal point in data collection and analysis on drug abuse
  
- Malaysian Government established a taskforce involving all drug enforcement agency in year 2009;
  - a) National Anti-Drugs Agency
  - b) Royal Malaysian Police
  - c) Royal Malaysian Custom
  - d) Pharmaceutical Services Division, Ministry of Health
  - e) Chemistry Department of Malaysia



# TASKFORCE DRUG ENFORCEMENT AGENCY



The taskforce has mutually agreed on:

- a) Standard format of data on drug abuse and user, drug crime, drug seizure and etc
- b) Dateline
- c) Information sharing
- d) NADA will prepare monthly reports to stakeholders and drug enforcement agencies



# DAINAP



❑ The taskforce for DAINAP has mutually agreed on:

## i. Quarter Data

- NADA's responsibility is to follow up with drug enforcement agencies and remind them on data submission due date.
- All agency must send the data at least 5 working days before the due date of data submission
- NADA is responsible to check and verify the data before key in the DAINAP System



# DAINAP



## ii. Annual Data

- NADA's responsibility is to follow up with drug enforcement agencies and remind them on data submission due date
- All agency must send the data at least 14 working days before the due date of data submission
- NADA will coordinate a meeting with all the drug enforcement agencies to verify the data before publishing annual report and DAINAP's annual data submission





# CONCLUSION



- Single agency as focal point to monitor, coordinate and verify data on drug abuse
- Establishment of taskforce is very important in discuss /share any problems or issues regarding to data collection
- Sharing information among drug enforcement agencies is important in formulating policy on war against drug abuse
