Outcome 1: information is managed


Outcome 2: information is **analysed** and **reported** Outcome 3: information is **used**

- Data sharing Asia Pacific ATS Information Centre (APAIC) and Analytical Reports












## Timeline 2010: Jan - Apr





## Timeline 2010: May - August










